

International Division wins prestigious design project in Nigeria.

The Delta State Government has awarded a contract to Davnotch Nigeria Limited for the construction of a Simple Cycle Gas Turbine (SCGT) based captive Power Plant at Oghareki in Nigeria. The plant shall have a capacity of two off 58MW Units.

In partnership with PSL Engineering & Control of Nigeria, MCE International has been awarded the design contract for The Oghareki Plant . The work, shall involve the conceptual and detailed design of all disciplines. The overall program is scheduled for completion late 2010 and as design work progresses, it is anticipated that MCE shall have some interface with the construction program's site work.

QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

On the 9th September 2009 MCE Group plc were successfully audited against the provisions of **ISO 9001: 2008** by *SGS Limited*. The success of this audit, maintains our ISO certification through until March 2012. The scoring of the audit resulted in two minor non-conformances and no observations.

Congratulations to all departments on this achievement.

On Friday 2 October 2009, MCE were audited by *Achilles* against compliance with the **Utility Vendor Database Verify (UVDB)** standard. The results showed an improvement on both the safety and environmental fronts, but a decline on the quality front, brought about by the introduction (by Achilles) of awarding points to companies who have received a quality award. (previously not included).

Thus, to account for this inclusion, our 100% record for quality assessment from the previous two audits has been reduced.
